Stream Valley continues to seek improvements for our road connectivity to the world beyond our community. We had a recent hearing, with another planned for April. We need the city to create another entrance to be located off Lazy Vale. We can't emphasise enough how important this is to Phase 1 of the Chadwell development project.

1. Need of a 3rd entrance/exit at the back of the neighborhood so there is traffic flow and


2. Limit the use of Stream Valley roads to be used as a pass through for Chadwell. Thanks You!!

Tl assure you all that your HOA board is well aware of the disturbances that have affected so many homeowners. I myself (Nancy) live in the townhomes that are in front of the three story apartments. Communication between Stream Valley and Mandolin/Epoch Residential is fluent! They are particularly on high alert on Wednesdays (Trash pickup). With respect for those of us more affected than others, the HOA wants you to know that you are well within your rights to be vigilant about your personal space and if necessary you may call the non-emergency police line. The Alley access is a city road and thus does not belong to Epoch or Mandolin. It is stated in their tenants leases that there is to be no access, no parking, and cars will be towed at the owners expense. In other words... It's illegal for them to have any use of our alley along Oglethorpe Drive. I am told that their hired subcontractors are where the proverbial fence (both literally and figuratively) gets pushed. If you have further inconveniences, concerns or a situation that barrs immediate attention, please contact anyone of your HOA board members.

Derived from the Sanskrit language

Namaste is formed by joining two words, namas and te. 'Namas' means 'bow', 'adorations', 'obeisance' and 'salutation'; and 'te' means 'to you'.

Therefore, the literal meaning of Namaste is 'bowing to you'.



While saying Namaste in the traditional style, you must bow slightly and press both the hands together, with fingers pointing upward, thumbs on the inside near the chest and palm touching – it is called Pranamasana (The Prayer Pose) or Anjali Mudra. Nowadays, Namaste can be said without the bow as well, but when you say it with the bow, it makes the greeting more formal and respectful, especially when you say it to an elder or an important person.
